



Your gifts continue to bolster our mission to permanently preserve and steward our beautiful natural landscape through conservation in our 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year. The past year was full of activity, and we are excited to share with you some of the ways your generosity has supported conservation in our Village.

- This spring, the Conservancy paid off the remaining debt on the Clark Preserve, a 38-acre expanse of old growth forest on Sherman Road. In August, GMLC accepted a small parcel of land along Berkshire Road through a land grant from the Cuyahoga Land Bank.
- Our volunteers completed annual inspections on 58 properties comprising 724 acres that GMLC has preserved. The Conservancy revised and renewed its five-year Strategic Plan, and we are currently preparing for our third, national re-accreditation with the Land Trust Accreditation Commission and its stringent governance standards.
- During 2023, the Conservancy increased our outreach to an already supportive community. In May, we sponsored four conservation "Walks and Talks" at the Sherman Road Preserve. We published three GMLC Newsletters in March, June, and September. And in collaboration with the Gates Mills Environmental Center and Mayfield Schools, GMLC sponsored our first Fall Speakers Seminar, "Preserving Gates Mills – Uniting for Land Water and Tree Conservation".



## Many Villagers wonder who was Judy Bell? Please read her tale from *In Our Own Voices: 20<sup>th</sup> Century Tales of Gates Mills*

One of the most cherished memories of someone who has grown up in Gates Mills is the Annual Christmas Tree Party celebrated on December 24<sup>th</sup> around a raging bonfire on The Polo Field. The event was conceived at a dinner party in 1926 when it was decided that it would be festive to organize a Christmas party for children. The hat was passed, and enough money was raised to underwrite the first party that was held behind the Hunt Club. Judy Bell was asked to organize the celebration.

Judy fielded a small committee to help her plan the first event. The first parties featured Christmas stockings made by Judy and her committee. Stockings for each child in the village were stuffed with candy. As the event grew in size and popularity, the Committee substituted store bought toys for the stockings. Between 1974 and 1978 candy was distributed. The expense of the children's gifts and the cost of refreshments to feed the growing number of attendees increased dramatically. Villagers were asked for contributions to help defray the cost of the party. Impressive quantities of food and drink were consumed by the revelers each year. In 1970 for example, 120 pounds of hot dogs, 80 dozen doughnuts and 8 pounds of coffee were purchased for the party from nearby merchants. In addition, as it did most years, **The Red Fox Inn** donated 35 gallons of hot chocolate for the occasion. The response by Villagers to this fund-raising appeal usually covers expenses. One year a former resident, now living in New Jersey, sent in a check because she had fond recollections of the magical Christmas Eves she had experienced here on The Polo Field as a child.

When Judy Bell retired from her position as "Mrs. Santa Claus" in 1966, a new Christmas Tree Committee was formed to take over the responsibilities associated with this annual event. Members of this early committee were Ann Fenohr, Millie Stanley, Lois Wellman and Bunny Marston. Upon Judy's death in 1968, **The Judy Bell Fund** was established in her memory to provide funds to purchase a tree in The Community House. Since 1971, children from the Gates Mills Elementary School decorate the tree each year with hand-made ornaments. This tradition was begun under the supervision of Joan Stephens and Jerri Gressle. It was later organized by Gloria Naji and Becky Smith. Barb Catalano now has the responsibility for organizing the children's ornamental efforts.

# LIGHTS FOR LIONS



Season's Greetings Gates Mills Villagers! For the past two years, Gates Mills has participated in the Cleveland Zoo's Light for Lions program and as a result, we have been able to divert several hundred pounds of broken holiday lights and extension cords from the landfills to directly benefit the non-profit organization Lion Landscapes. Sadly, lion and cheetah populations have decreased by over 40% in the past two decades, partly due to human-animal conflict. And while Lion Landscapes has yet to fully evaluate strategies to assist its human counterparts from engaging in conflict with their in-laws over the holidays, they have found great success in developing long-term conservation programs to protect big cats in Tanzania.

Starting the first week in December through the end of January 2024, collection boxes will be available in the entrance way to Town Hall and the Community House. Broken and/or used holiday lights and extension cords can be placed in the boxes but **please do not include any packaging.** The Cleveland Zoo will recycle the material and the proceeds will be donated to Lion Landscapes. 




